

What is the Fellowship?

NYU School of Law General Counsel Fellowship

The New York University (NYU) School of Law General Counsel Fellowship (Fellowship) permits five Fellows to spend one year in residence at the general counsel office of a highly regarded nonprofit organization. Possible host organizations include, but are not limited to the Vera Institute of Justice (New Orleans office), Open Society Foundations, the Office of General Counsel at Yale University, the NYU Office of the General Counsel, and the Office of the General Counsel at Stevens Institute for Technology.

The Fellows will delve into an unusually wide variety of legal and organizational issues and will participate in the legal work conducted by general counsel offices, including matters pertaining to corporate transactions, tax issues, intellectual property, employment and labor law, litigation, and real estate transactions.

Term and Salary

The term of the Fellowship is one year. Fellows are funded annually at a salary of \$36,000.

Who can be a Fellow?

Fellowships will be awarded to five J.D. candidates graduating from NYU School of Law in May 2014.

Fellows are selected for their scholarship and leadership. Fellows will be selected without regard to the applicant's race, color, religion, gender, political beliefs, national origin, disability, age, or sexual orientation.
